JUBILEE YEAR 2025 PILGRIMS OF HOPE

Pope Francis has declared 2025 a Jubilee Year, marking it as a special time of grace that calls us toward a deeper holiness and strengthens our witness of God's loving mercy to the world. In his Papal Bull, the Holy Father reminds us that

"hope does not disappoint" (Rm 5:5), articulating his desire for this Jubilee Year to foster a renewed climate of hope and spiritual rejuvenation within the Church, energising our mission to the world.

JUBILEE PLENARY INDULGENCE

Pope Francis invites us to embrace God's mercy through the Jubilee plenary indulgence, which offers forgiveness of sin's effects and frees us from the burdens of our past. This gift of mercy empowers a virtuous life and fosters reconciliation with God and

others. It is available to **all** who are repentant, detached from sin, and seeking renewal.

The next section explains how to receive this grace by fulfilling the steps for the Jubilee Year.

How to obtain the Jubilee indulgence

During the Holy Year 2025, you can receive a plenary indulgence (complete forgiveness of the temporal effects of sin) by meeting **all** of the following conditions:



Detachment from sin:

Resolve to avoid all sin, including venial sins, and turn toward God.



Sacrament of Reconciliation:

Go to Reconciliation within 20 days before or after performing the indulgenced act.



Eucharistic

Communion: Receive Holy Communion, ideally on the same day as the indulgenced act.



Prayers for the pope's

intentions: Pray for the pope's intentions, such as an Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory Be. **See Page 14 for suggested prayers.**

complete **one or more** of the following acts, each offering an opportunity for spiritual renewal and grace:



Pilgrimage: Visit designated Jubilee sites in the diocese and participate in prayers or liturgical celebrations such as Mass, Adoration, the Rosary, or other devotions offered at the site. **See Page 14 for a list of pilgrim prayers to guide you during your visits.**



Acts of charity and mercy: Engage in charitable actions to serve those in need, embodying Christ's call to show compassion and care for others.



Spiritual growth and formation:

Attend retreats or study Church teachings, including Vatican II and the *Catechism*, using resources like *Come and See, Go and Make—A Vision for Parishes*.

To obtain a plenary indulgence, after meeting the general conditions, you must



Fasting and self-sacrifice: Embrace penance by fasting, avoiding distractions, and dedicating time and resources to help the vulnerable.



Papal blessing: Receive a papal blessing imparted by Bishop Brian Mascord during one of his visits to the Jubilee sites, along with all associated indulgences.



Provisions for those unable to travel: Those unable to visit pilgrimage sites due to illness or serious reasons can still receive the indulgence by uniting spiritually with the faithful through prayers and acts of mercy, following the usual conditions.

A gift of mercy for the living and the dead

Indulgences may be offered for the deceased to aid in purifying their souls in purgatory. One plenary indulgence may be gained per day, but an additional indulgence can be offered for a soul in purgatory with a second act of charity or devotion and reception of Holy Communion.

Through prayer, penance, and charity, let us embrace the grace of the Jubilee Year and renew ourselves

A GUIDE TO THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

Take time in quiet prayer to reflect on your thoughts, words and actions, inviting God to bring about a true *metanoia*—a turning back to God. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a sacred encounter with God’s infinite mercy, restoring us to grace and renewing our hearts.

As followers of Jesus, we are invited to reflect on our lives, recognising where our thoughts, words, deeds or omissions may have fallen short, and to bring these before God for his forgiveness and healing.

Sin, whether mortal or venial, can harm our relationship with God. For a sin to be mortal, it must meet the following conditions:

1. Grave matter, such as actions that go against the Ten Commandments.
2. Full knowledge of its seriousness.
3. Full consent of the will.

Venial sins, while less serious, are absolved in the Holy Eucharist. Yet, confessing them strengthens us and deepens our trust in God’s mercy.

God longs to forgive and restore you. Return with confidence, for he welcomes you with open arms and rejoices in your transformation!

Preparing for the Sacrament of Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a sacred moment with Jesus, who longs to forgive. Begin with prayer and seek guidance from the priest if you need assistance.

A prayer before Reconciliation:

Come Holy Spirit into my soul, enlighten my mind that I may know the sins I ought to confess, and grant me your grace to confess them fully, humbly, and with a contrite heart. Amen.

During Reconciliation

(Begin with the Sign of the Cross, and then say:)

Forgive me, Father, for I have sinned. It has been *(state how long)* since my last Confession, and these are my sins:

(Confess all sins honestly, including mortal sins with their frequency and any venial sins. Listen to the priest's guidance and penance, then pray an Act of Contrition:)

My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Our Saviour Jesus Christ suffered and died for us. In his name, my God, have mercy. Amen.

After Reconciliation and prayer

Complete the penance, thank God for his mercy, and commit to holiness:

Heavenly Father, thank you for your forgiveness and grace. Help me stay faithful and grow in holiness. Amen.
