PROGRAM INFORMATION

Thank you to everyone who has participated in the 2023 Professional Development Program for Diocesan Leadership. As we pass the half point of this year, there are still some opportunities for professional development available and we have summarised the remaining workshops for 2023 in the calendar below. Please remember to read the workshop descriptions on pages 4–7 before enrolling to verify that the content of the workshop will be valuable to your ministry/work.

As in years past, all diocesan leaders must complete **at least 10 units** of professional development in the areas of professional standards and safeguarding every calendar year. It is the responsibility of each diocesan leader to guarantee that their duties under this program are met. Engagement with professional development in the areas of safeguarding and professional standards helps us to learn and grow together as professionals and is evidence of our commitment to ensuring that our diocese is a safe place for everyone.

The professional development opportunities in this program are opportunities provided by the Diocese to help you in fulfilling the professional development requirement mandated by the Bishop for persons in position of leadership in the diocese. However, it should be noted that there are several external professional development courses available that will also fulfill the mandate criteria. As a result, if you attend a workshop delivered by an external provider that addresses subjects related to safeguarding and professional standards, you may be eligible for credit points for your participation in the external course.

Only those who have registered for the workshop will get an email ahead of time with the ZOOM link and the specific information for the workshop, such as changes to the method of delivery or location of the session. Understanding the role of Emotional Intelligence

Description: Emotional intelligence (EI) is one's ability to perceive, use, understand, manage, and handle emotions; something that is critical in all areas of ministry to ensure that we are interacting in safe and appropriate ways for the various people that we encounter. This workshop will provide you with an overview of the key findings of EI from neuroscience, whilst examining the process of developing EI and how we can increase it. Participants will also consider EI in the context of leadership styles and their role in managing communication and difficult conversations/behaviours.

Child focused safety practices across environments

Description: Presented by NAPCAN, 'Creating A Child Safe Organisation' will provide information on how, as an organisation, we can ensure that we are meeting all our legislative requirements to implement child-safe organisational practice. In addition to this the workshop will focus on establishing a culture that supports and engages children and families; and how as an organisation we can develop the right policies, procedures, and practices to keep children safe.

Trauma Informed Practice

Description: Trauma Informed Practice is essential in creating a safe environment for all persons. Trauma informed practice helps to facilitate empowerment and recovery and instils hope, optimism, and the understanding that recovery and post-traumatic growth are possible. By the end of this workshop, participants will have a better understanding of trauma-informed practice and how to practical implement trauma-informed practice in their ministry/work environments.

Responding to child disclosures – positive practices

Description: By describing in detail how to manage a disclosure, help a child or family in danger, and see early signs or risk factors, the course will help support you in identifying harm and the legal obligation associated with disclosures of abuse. This workshop will give you the tools to ensure the safety of children and vulnerable people, including how responses to disclosures of abuse can have a profound impact on their ability to feel safe and recover from the trauma of abuse.

Managing challenging behaviours while building a positive workspace

Description: This course will guide you in dealing with challenging behaviours and how to foster a positive workplace. The course will address techniques for resolving disagreements and promoting a productive office atmosphere. This course also demonstrates to you how to enable children to self-regulate their own behaviour, set behavioural standards, and provide a framework for social-emotional learning.

Engaging positively with children when raising concerns

Description: Prior to developing specialised skills in the area of child protection and safeguarding, it is first important to ensure that a sound understanding of the foundational principles is achieved. This workshop will provide an overview of the legislative obligations and diocesan requirements expected of those in ministry and in working with children, young people, and adults at risk. Anyone in leadership who is new to the Diocese of Wollongong is required to complete this workshop. This workshop is also appropriate for anyone who would like a refresher on basic child protection principles and associated diocesan policies.
